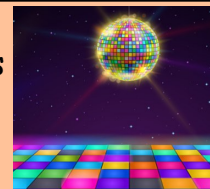
What's happening at your school... Read on...

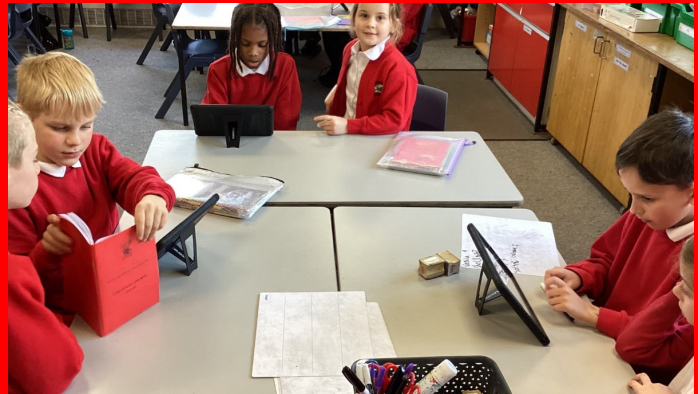
Year 3 have been digging into history with a focus on the changing Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. Lots of interesting discussion in this lesson!

Activity 1: Collecting Data into a Table

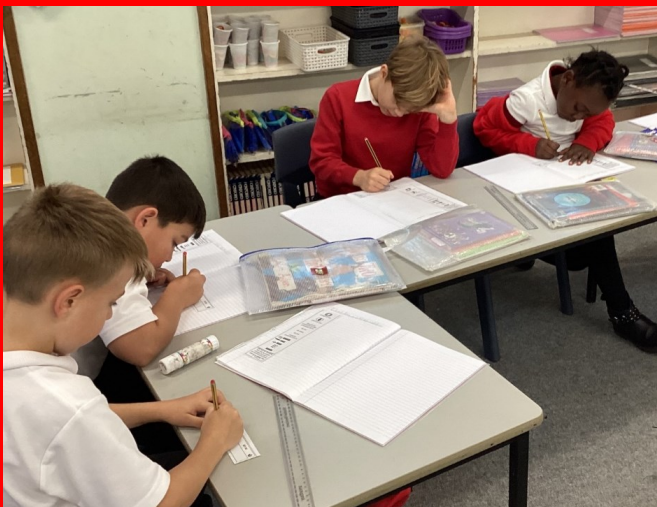
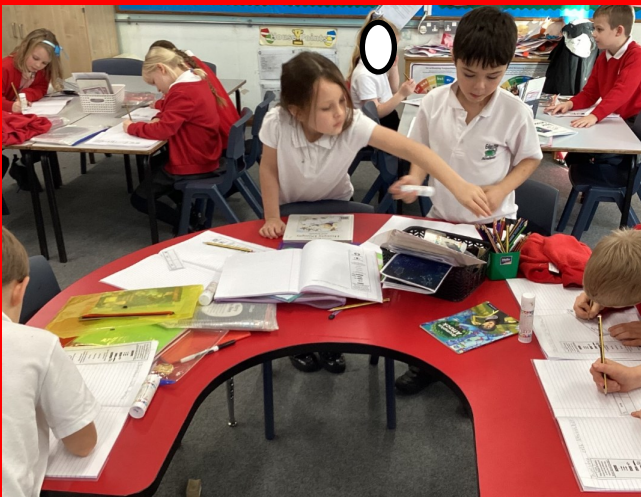
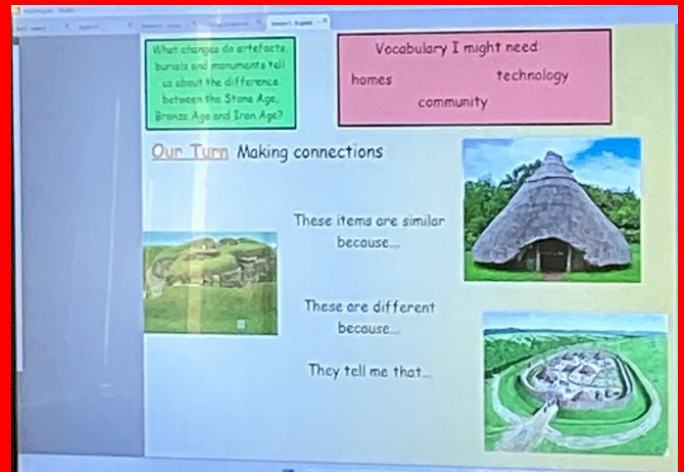
1. Decide which data to collect.

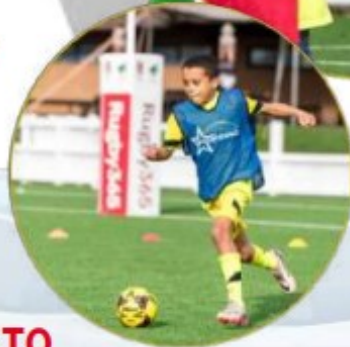
